OVER 80 LEADING ARTISTS AND ARCHITECTS UNITE FOR CURE³, A SELLING EXHIBITION IN AID OF THE CURE PARKINSON'S TRUST - BONHAMS, LONDON. 25-28TH OCTOBER

The Cure Parkinson's Trust, in association with Bonhams and Artwise, is delighted to announce **Cure³** 2018, the 2nd edition of the acclaimed selling exhibition devised to raise awareness and funds for Parkinson's research. Featuring original commissions by more than 80 international artists, Cure³ is an opportunity to buy covetable art whilst supporting the vital work of The Trust.

Co-Founded in 2005 by Tom Isaacs, The Cure Parkinson's Trust (CPT) is a charitable organisation created by and for people living with Parkinson's. CPT has one bold aim – **to find a cure for Parkinson's.** CPT funds and supports pioneering research into new treatments which offer real hope of a cure to the more than 10 million people living with the condition worldwide.

Tom lived an inspirational life with Parkinson's, devoted to the cause of CPT. He was passionate about the Cure³ project from the beginning and it was Tom's description of living with Parkinson's as feeling like being 'boxed in' that inspired Artwise with the concept from which Cure³ was borne. Tom passed away on May 31st, 2017 and Cure³ 2018 is dedicated to his memory and incredible achievements.

Cure³ will include a host of major new artists for 2018 and the addition of important names from the world of architecture. Each artist has been invited to create a unique artwork using a bespoke Perspex box 20cm^3 . The cube can be used in any way the artist chooses; as frame, support or to contain. Prices for these highly sought-after and collectable art works will range from under £1,000 to over £20,000. The cubes will be on view to the public at Bonhams, London from $26^{\text{th}} - 28^{\text{th}}$ October (with the Private view on 25^{th}), and are available to purchase on www.cure3.co.uk from 8am on 26th October 2018.

Format of Selling Exhibition Please note that this is not an auction, each art work will be individually priced by the artist and sold at this fixed price during the four-day exhibition and for a limited period following the exhibition from the dedicated web platform being created. All the proceeds will go directly to The Cure Parkinson's Trust, to fund research to slow, stop or reverse Parkinson's disease.

The Cure Parkinson's Trust (CPT) was founded in 2005 by four people living with Parkinson's. CPT takes a patient-centric approach to funding innovative projects and inspirational scientists with the potential to change the course of the condition and make a difference to the lives of people with Parkinson's. Parkinson's is a debilitating condition affecting over 145,000 people in the UK alone and 10 million people worldwide. It is a neurological disorder characterised by tremors, stiffness, slowness of movement and balance problems. It is predicted that 1 person in 37 will receive a diagnosis of Parkinson's in their lifetime.

The Cure Parkinson's Trust is the only organisation in the UK solely dedicated to finding a cure for Parkinson's. At CPT we believe that we are closer than ever to new treatments. For over ten years, we have been committed to strategically funding research to find a cure for the condition once and for all. The charity's Linked Clinical Trials (LCT) programme identifies potential new treatments by taking existing drugs used to treat other diseases and testing them as treatments for Parkinson's. Our role is to develop clinical trials to understand if these

drugs may be effective to slow, stop or even reverse the progression of Parkinson's. We believe that our pioneering and collaborative approach to research will one day soon, deliver curative treatments for Parkinson's.

Around 145,000 people in the UK are living with Parkinson's, and it is predicted that one in 37 people will receive a diagnosis of Parkinson's in their lifetime. CPT funds innovative research which is dedicated to finding new treatments that can slow, stop or reverse Parkinson's.
