

has transformed a Soviet-era
kiosk in the Latvian capital into
Open for Business (until 28 Oct),
a Brexit-inspired installation.

Louisa Hutton's practice
Sauerbruch Hutton presents
oxymoron, an installation for
the Arsenale at the Venice
Architecture Biennale (until 25
Nov), while Foster + Partners,
the firm of Norman Foster and
Spencer de Grey, have designed
one of the chapels for the Vatican
Pavilion (until 25 Nov).

GOOD CAUSES

To celebrate the 70th anniversary of the NHS, David Mach and Chris Orr are among artists who have produced prints in support of the Imperial Health Charity, on sale online through CCA Galleries. The charity gives grants for healthcare projects to a group of London hospitals and also excels in its provision of art, with a collection of over 2,000 works. In May, Imperial Health won the Hallett Independent Acquisitions Award at the London Original Print Fair; the prize was £8,000 to purchase prints for the collection at the fair.

To raise funds for the Cure Parkinson's Trust, more than 80 artists and architects have produced artworks in bespoke Perspex boxes for 'Cure', a selling show at Bonhams, London (25–28 Oct). Participating RAs include Ron Arad, Tony Bevan, Piers Gough, Spencer de Grey, Nicholas Grimshaw, Nigel Hall, Michael Hopkins, Paul Huxley, Vanessa Jackson, Tess Jaray, Anish Kapoor, Phillip King, John Maine, Humphrey Ocean, Conrad Shawcross and Chris Wilkinson.

PAINTERS AND PRINTMAKERS

Ian McKeever has three exhibitions: a show with sculptor Richard Deacon at Galleri Susanne Ottesen, Copenhagen (until 6 Oct), an exhibition of prints at the Young Gallery, Salisbury (8 Sep-27 Oct), and a survey show of paintings at Ferens Art Gallery, Hull (20 Oct-13 Jan 2019).

Christopher Le Brun's exhibition 'Composer' is at Southampton City Art Gallery (14 Sep-12 Jan 2019). A show of Paula Rego's drawings takes place at London's Marlborough Fine Art (12 Sep-20 Oct); Joe Tilson also shows at Marlborough (until 8 Sep) and at Alan Cristea (until 22 Sep). A Bridport Arts Centre show celebrates Philip Sutton's 90th birthday (until 6 Oct), while drawings by Jeffery Camp are on show at Art Space Gallery, London (7 Sep-12 Oct). Chris Orr shows at the Brook Gallery, Budleigh Salterton (until 23 Sep), and gives a talk at the town's literary festival (23 Sep). Orr curates 'The Masters: Screen and Stone' at Bankside Gallery, London (7-18 Nov).

Ian Ritchie has an exhibition of monotypes of the Standing Stones of Stenness at the Stromness Library, Orkney, in aid of the John Rae Society (until 6 Oct). Stafford Gallery, Wimbledon, presents paintings by Fred Cuming (16-30 Sep). Eileen Cooper shows at Rabley Gallery, Marlborough (15 Sep-20 Oct).

Paintings and works on paper by Tess Jaray are on view at Frieze Masters, London, at the Karsten Schubert stand (3-7 Oct). Mali Morris has an open studio at APT Studios & Gallery, London (28-30 Sep) and participates in the group show 'Touch' at Candida Stevens Gallery, Chichester (22 Sep-27 Oct). Jennifer Durrant takes part in a two-person show at Linden Hall Studio, Deal (until 30 Sep). Eileen Cooper, Chris Orr, Alison Wilding, Anne Desmet and Nigel Hall show at Caroline Wiseman at the Aldeburgh Beach Lookout, Suffolk (1-31 Oct, by appointment). Works by Michael Craig-Martin, Gary Hume, Isaac Julien and Grayson Perry are included in 'Michael Jackson: On the Wall' at the National Portrait Gallery, London (until 21 Oct).



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
